Substantive Change Committee Actions

At its **February 29, 2016** meeting, the Committee on Substantive Change of the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges, Western Association of Schools and Colleges, took the following actions:

Distance Education

Allan Hancock College: approved 16 associate degrees and one certificate program to be offered at 50% or more via distance education or electronic delivery.

Gavilan College: approved 41 associate degrees and 38 certificate programs to be offered 50% or more via distance education or electronic delivery.

Modesto College: approved six associate degrees three certificate programs to be offered 50% or more via distance education or electronic delivery.

Moorpark College: approved 18 associate degrees and 11 certificates programs be offered 50% or more via distance education or electronic delivery.

San Jose City College: approved 46 associate degrees and 22 certificates programs be offered 50% or more via distance education or electronic delivery.

Santa Rosa Junior College: approved 21 associate degrees and 12 certificates programs be offered 50% or more via distance education or electronic delivery.

Skyline College: approved six associate degrees and six certificates programs be offered 50% or more via distance education or electronic delivery.

New Locations

Riverside City College: approved the new Coil School for the Arts. A site visit is required within six months.

Victor Valley College: approved the new Regional Public Safety Training Center in Apple Valley. A site visit is required within six months.

Woodland Community College: approved the realignment of the Yuba College Lake County Campus to Woodland Community College.

New Programs

Carrington College: approved program expansion to add programs to additional locations. Site visit are required at the lab facilities.

Porterville College: approved a new certificate program Logistics Management.

Riverside City College: approved the Culinary Arts Program to be offered at the new Coil School for the Arts.
