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## ACCJC Names Dr. Mac Powell as Next President

**Sacramento, CA** – The Board of Directors of the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC) is pleased to announce that Dr. Mac Powell will be joining ACCJC as President effective July 18, 2022.



For the past five years, Dr. Powell has served as Senior Vice President of the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities and supported the agency's 163 institutions and 1.3 Million students. He led NWCCU's 2020 Standards Revision, developed the Commission's Mission Fulfillment Fellowship, supported two federal re-recognitions, and was the agency's primary conduit to the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, which provided millions of dollars to support the expansion of agency capacity around closing institutional equity gaps in its member institutions.

Prior to joining the Commission, Dr. Powell served as president of three universities, including John F. Kennedy University, where he led the institution's successful efforts to become a service-learning institution and a federally recognized and funded Hispanic Serving Institution.

Dr. Powell has contributed to the strategic direction of higher education through his service as Chair of the American Council of Education's Commission on Educational Attainment and Innovation, as a Commissioner on the Western Association of Schools and Colleges Senior Commission, as a graduate of the WASC Assessment Leadership Academy, and as Chair of the Council of Applied Master's Programs in Psychology. His enthusiasm for continuous improvement and innovation and his breadth of experience add new perspectives, and position ACCJC to continue to embrace the challenging landscape of higher education.

"There is nothing more transformative than education, and the power of ACCJC member institutions to influence the lives of students and their communities is deeply inspiring. Having worked alongside ACCJC staff, member institutions, and the students that they serve for so many years, it is an honor to be joining the ACCJC family. He is a champion for institutional innovation, excellence, and continuous improvement as the path forward to strengthening all students' educational achievements. Dr. Powell holds bachelor's degrees in philosophy and sociology, a master's degree in sociology, and a doctorate in sociology from the University of Missouri, as well as an MBA from National University and a master's degree in clinical psychology from Antioch University.

As the author of over 50 articles, three books and two book chapters on the subjects of education, clinical psychology and performance psychology, his most recent scholarship focuses on the role of accreditation in promoting institutional transformation and the closure of institutional equity gaps. Dr. Powell has spoken around the world on leadership, the role of personality in building teams and performance, and the future of higher education. He has been a long-time volunteer for the Point Foundation, supporting college education for underserved LGBTQ students, and was one of the original members of the LGBTQ Leaders in Higher Education. His partner, Tuan Ngo, is a graduate and member of the board of trustees of Occidental College in Eagle Rock, California.
