Brooke Gregory has over 25 years of experience as an educator, professional mentor and policy consultant. Her service to students, educators and community included teaching at the middle and high school levels, serving as Dean of Students, Assistant Principal and Principal. At the district level, Brooke was Executive Director of Student Success and Multicultural Services, Executive Director of High School Education, Assistant Superintendent of Human Resources, Assistant Superintendent of Educational Operations and Chief of Strategic Initiatives in Cherry Creek Schools (Denver metropolitan area).



She has worked with community groups, legislators and the Western States Benchmarking Consortium to promote and accelerate the development of school and community environments, as well as practices and policies, that nurture the genius and wellbeing in all children -- particularly those who are predictably marginalized based on race, primary language, citizenship status, and financial resources.

Over her 20 years as an administrator, Brooke provided key leadership in the hiring, advancement and retention of Black, Latinx, Indigenous, Asian and multi-racial educators. As a result of her work, she received the inaugural Honorable John W. Buckner Leadership Award from Pacific Educational Group, Inc. (PEG) in 2015. She has received numerous community awards or professional recognition for her advocacy for students, staff and communities of color. Brooke has been a presenter, featured speaker and keynote at educational and community conferences and events over the past 15 years.

Following a nearly two decades long professional relationship with PEG, Brooke was selected by founder and president, Glenn E. Singleton, as his successor (in 2021), and she joined the company in August 2019. Brooke is a graduate of the University of Colorado-Boulder and the University of Colorado-Denver, and resides in the Denver area.
